SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

Fire hazard : Flammable liquid and vapor.

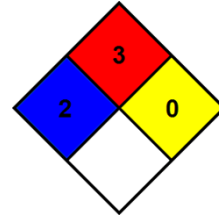
